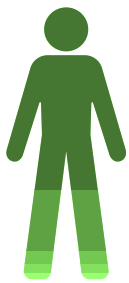


About The Boulevard of Chicago

The Boulevard of Chicago pioneered the model of adapting medical respite for homeless services, becoming the third such facility in the U.S. in 1994. Today, The Boulevard is dedicated to serving hundreds of men and women who are experiencing homelessness. Our four Cornerstone Programs include **Medical Respite, Housing, Behavioral Health** and **Workforce Development**. The Boulevard's residential facility is a 44-bed medical respite care center, which includes an on-site health clinic that is staffed by PCC Community Wellness Center. Through a continuum of programs and services, we help our residents gain the stability they need to restore their health and rebuild their lives.

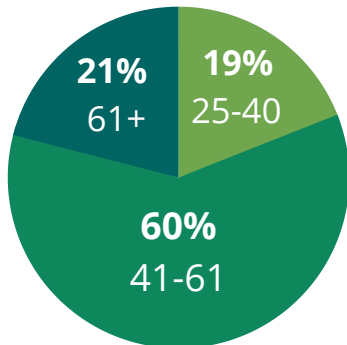

- 16% Less than a Week
- 20% 8-30 Days
- 22% 31-90 Days
- 26% 91-180 Days
- 16% Over 6 Months

Outcomes

91% of residents completed their medical recovery plan

73% of residents with mental health issues followed their psychosocial service plan

80% of discharged residents moved into stable housing

97% of permanently housed clients remained housed for a year or longer

76 individuals enrolled in The Boulevard's Workforce Development Program
