In addition to caring for clients at its Chicago facility, The Boulevard serves residents of the Lake Street Studios, a supportive housing development on Chicago's Near West Side. Richard has resided at Lake Street Studios since its

opening in 2015. After losing his job, Richard worked with several temporary agencies until he was referred to The Boulevard in December 2019. While enrolled in our Employment Services Program, he greatly enhanced his job readiness skills. In a short time, Richard was ready to be referred to the Cara Chicago/Clean Slate Program where he excelled. Just a few months later, he was hired in Illinois Masonic Medical Center's Environmental Services Department. Now, Richard is thriving at home and at work – and expresses gratitude for the help he got from The Boulevard. We congratulate Richard for his hard work and perseverance.

Gary's Story: Finding Purpose in Retirement



After a successful career as a derivatives trader and business owner, Gary Tomal was in the perfect position to relax in retirement. Instead, he and his wife Gail spend their time helping others. Born and raised on the west side of Chicago, Gary never forgot his roots. When he discovered The Boulevard, he immediately saw the organization's impact in breaking the cycle of homelessness.

Jim Sweeting, a former resident of The Boulevard, is a valued member of The Boulevard's Board, providing important onthe-ground perspective. Jim's Boulevard experience mirrored many of our

clients. During his stay, staff created a medical and behavioral health plan; the wellness clinic helped him regain his strength; and the 24-hour resident life services team made his recuperation comfortable. During his stay, he attended sessions on emotional health and took part in job readiness programs. Eventually, he moved out with the encouragement of the staff, ready to take back control of his life.

Now, three years after leaving The Boulevard, Jim enjoys serving on the Board and looks forward to visiting the house post-pandemic. "I really miss visiting The Boulevard; I used to go twice a week. I would sit in the community meetings and be there to support the residents. It's important to share my gratitude by helping, by just being there."
